

HUNTING CHECK LIST:

- Rifle case (hard and locking- aluminium is recommended)
- Rifle with scope and detachable sling (No semi-automatics are allowed)
- Soft rifle case for rifle protection on the hunting vehicle/charter flight
- Cartridges - 40 to 60 rounds (All the same bullet weight, which in most instances should be the heaviest offered).
- Earplugs (for zeroing your rifle)
- Cartridge holder & belt - 10 cartridge capacity
- Binoculars (compact to medium size, 7 or 8 power)
- Cleaning kit (pull-through type, including a silicone cloth & snake bore)
- Solvent (plastic bottle or adhesive wrapped)
- 2 x rolls of black or camouflaged DUCT tape

MISCELLANEOUS:

- Passport (Check individual countries for visa requirements)
- Airline tickets
- Customs certificates (Form 4457) for rifles, cameras and binoculars
- Traveller's checks/cash
- U-shaped neck pillow (blow-up) for flight (optional)
- Day pack to carry hunting equipment
- Camera equipment, extra batteries, flash (200mm telephoto lens minimum for wildlife photography, spare memory card)
- Sunglasses & watch
- Flashlight (anything over 80 lumens for around camp) and extra batteries.
- Knife (Swiss Army type or Leatherman Tool- **remember to place in your checked luggage**)
- Spare scope for your rifle (optional)
- Sunblock, suntan lotion
- Personal medicines, including any personal prescriptions plus anti-malarial tablets, antacids, analgesics (aspirin or Tylenol), Kaopectate or Peptobismal, Caladryl lotion, lip balm with sun screen, throat lozengers, disinfectant wipes, antiseptic cream, insect repellent, anti-histamines etc.
- Lens cleaning kit or tissue (for rifle scope and camera)
- Toiletries / hairdryer / hotbrush – 220v. May need transformer / adapter

CLOTHING CHECKLIST:

- Shirts, 2-3 khaki, grey or green, wash & wear shirts (long sleeve recommended, as these can be rolled up if it gets warm enough – also helps prevent sun-burn)
- Hunting Pants (lightweight & breathable): 2-3 comfortable pair, wash & wear (khaki, grey, beige or green preferred)
- Shorts, 1 or 2 pair, wash and wear, mid-thigh or zip off long trousers.

- Sport shirts, 2-3, wash and wear
- Comfortable, breathable socks, 4-5 pair, cotton or wool (preferably not white)
- Underwear, 4-5 pair
- Jacket or wind-breaker / Sweater (Jersey) - khaki, grey or green.
- Gloves
- Soft type hat (with brim) or baseball cap in a natural colour. (The Steward Granger type felt safari hats can be impractical as they get hung up on thorn-bushes.)
- Hunting shoes. Whatever you're most comfortable in, be they athletic-type hiking shoes or sturdy hiking boots. Make sure they're well broken in, with flat rubber soles. If you are prone to blisters bring thick socks, moleskin and polypropylene sock inserts.
- Comfortable camp shoes or moccasins.
- Bathing suit.

PLEASE NOTE:

1. Please don't bring any military camouflage clothing on safari.
2. The maximum amount of ammunition you are allowed to carry on the airlines is 5 kilograms (11 lbs). This should be packed in your checked luggage.
3. You will be issued a Visitors Firearms Certificate by Customs on arrival. This Certificate must remain with the rifle and ammunition at all times.

TIP: Please carry your binoculars, camera and other valuables in your carry-on bag. Take two loosely packed suitcases with half your clothing in each one. That way if the airline loses one of the suitcases you'll have something to hunt in once you arrive. You'll also have room in your suitcases to take souvenirs home.
